MEDICAL ALERT CARD



Instructions for Printing and Cutting Your Medical Alert Card:

- Print the card on regular or heavy-weight paper for durability.
- Cut out the card carefully along the dotted lines.
- Fold the card in half so the printed sides face outward.
- Laminate the card for extra protection (optional but recommended).
- Keep the card in your wallet, purse, or with your identification at all times.



Respiratory Care Information Card

Normal Partial Pressure of Carbon Dioxide (PCO2) and
End Tidal Carbon Dioxide (CO2): 35-45 mmHg

Normal Oxygen Saturation (SaO2): 95-100%

Risk for individuals with Neuromuscular Disease: Respiratory Failure

DO NOT GIVE OXYGEN before checking end tidal or blood CO2 level. A low
oxyhemoglobin saturation may indicate CO2 retention and a need for positive
pressure ventilation. IF supplemental Oxygen is given, continuously
Monitor CO2. Non-invasive bi-level ventilation may be required.

Mechanically assisted cough helps clear mucus when cough is weak and/or
Ineffective.
